#### The Kinder Houston Area Survey (1982-2016)


Thirty-five years of systematic interviews with representative samples of Harris County residents, focused on three central issues:

#### Percent increase in before-tax income

Two contrasting economic eras (1949 to 1979 and 1980 to 2014)

The 30 years after World War II were a period of broad-based prosperity.

The past 35 years have been marked by growing income inequalities.





- The 30 years after World War II (1949-1979)

# The education requirements for jobs in America (1970-2020)










## The perceived importance of post-secondary education (the three counties combined, 2016)




### The number of documented U.S. immigrants, by decade (1820-2010)








#### Cities with large numbers of foreign born residents (2010-2014)








### The demographic transformations of Harris County (1960-2010)




































## The current population of Harris County by age group and ethnicity (2014)




## The current population of the United States by age group and ethnicity (2014)






## The projected population of the United States by age group and ethnicity in 2050







#### Educational attainment by ethnicity, age 25 and older (2005-2015)








#### Percent of Latinos by time in the U.S.

Socioeconomic status among Latinos by time in the U.S. and by generation (2005-2014)







Owns the place where lives


Self and family have health insurance

## Interethnic friendships among Latinos by time in the U.S. and by generation (1994-2014)






#### Attitudes toward immigrants (2010-2016)

Percent expressing positive feelings (6 to 10 on a 10-point scale) about "undocumented immigrants."


Favor: "Granting illegal immigrants in the U.S. a path to legal citizenship, if they speak English and have no criminal record."

### Interethnic romantic relationships by age among Anglos (2007, 2011 and 2014 combined)






Ethnic attitudes by age among Anglos (2007–2015, combined)

"The increasing ethnic diversity in Houston brought about by immigration is a *good thing*, rather than a bad thing."




Favor: "granting illegal immigrants in the U.S. a path to legal citizenship, if they speak English and have no criminal record."




Percent of Anglos agreeing, by age:

"The increasing immigration into this country today mostly *strengthens*, rather than threatens, American culture."






### The relation between personal income and beliefs about the role of government (1994-2015)








### The relation between personal income and assessments of discrimination (1994-2014)

"Have you ever been in a romantic relationship with someone who was not African-American?"






Perceived discrimination by age among Blacks (1994–2014, combined)


Blacks and other minorities have the same opportunities as whites in U.S. today.



Black people in the U.S. are still a long way from having the same chance in life that white people have.




In general, the criminal justice system in Houston is biased against blacks.
